## A message from Dr. Valerie Boaz and the Hamilton County Health Department:

"The COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, free and accessible. The unvaccinated are particularly at risk of serious illness, hospitalization and death from COVID-19. We want to encourage anyone who has not been vaccinated to get the vaccine."

## Hamilton County Vaccination Rates As of November 1, 2021:

**51%** of **Hamilton County** residents have been fully vaccinated  
**45%** of **White** residents have been vaccinated  
**36%** of **Black** residents have been vaccinated  
**52%** of **Hispanic** residents have been vaccinated

## People may get the vaccine, if they:

- Are 5 years of age and older
- Have chronic medical conditions
- Have immunocompromising conditions
- Have autoimmune diseases
- Have Bell's palsy
- Have Guillain-Barre'
- Have allergies to foods (such as peanuts and shellfish), pets, venom, environmental agents or oral medications
- Are pregnant or breastfeeding
- Need other vaccines, including the flu vaccine

## The COVID-19 vaccines:

- Are safe and effective
- Do not change or interact with your DNA
- Do not change or affect your reproductive system
- Do not contain microchips
- Will not make you magnetic
- Do not contain the live virus, so they cannot infect you
- Do not contain eggs, latex or preservatives
