MEDICAL RESERVE CORPS VOLUNTEERS

PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCIES

Medical Reserve Corps volunteers with the Chattanooga Hamilton County Health Department will be utilized to support public health emergencies. The Health Department has developed an all-hazards public health emergency response plan addressing infectious disease outbreaks and natural or man-made disasters. The need for volunteers will be critical for an efficient and organized response.

Volunteers will help with:

- ◆ Emergency clinics for mass vaccination or medication distribution
- ◆ Medical professionals may be asked to volunteer at hospitals during a medical emergency causing a surge of patients at local hospitals
- ◆ Other emergencies involving public health and healthcare as appropriate
